

Salvador Anton Clavé is a Full Professor of Regional Geographical Analysis at the Rovira i Virgili University, Catalonia (Spain) and Senior Research Scholar at the International Institute of Tourism Studies at the George Washington University (USA).

During the academic year 2015-16 and as Visiting Research Scholar at the International Institute of Tourism Studies at the George Washington University, he conducted joint research with the Centre of Real Estate and Urban Analysis on the impacts of Walkability on tourism performance of cities located in the metropolitan area of Washington DC.

He currently serves as Director of the Doctoral Program in Tourism and Leisure at the Rovira i Virgili University where he is also the Principal Researcher of the Research Group of Territorial Analysis and Tourism Studies. He has served as director/dean of the Tourism and Leisure School/Faculty of Tourism and Geography at the Rovira I Virgili University between 2002 and 2014. His research concentrates on analysis of the evolution of tourist destinations, urban and regional tourism planning, theme parks design, management, development and globalization, tourism and ICT and issues concerning tourism policies and local development from an evolutionary approach. He has published in journals such as *Annals of Tourism Research, Journal of Destination Marketing and Management, Journal of Sustainable Tourism, European Urban and Regional Studies, Tourism Geographies or Journal of Policy Research in Tourism, Leisure and Events and among his most relevant major publications are his books entitled <i>The Global Theme Park Industry* (CABI, 2007) *Análisis Territorial del Turismo y Planificación de Destinos Turísticos* (Tirant lo Blanch, 2011, co-authored with JF. Vera, F. López and M. Marchena), *Geographies of Tourism: European Research Perspectives* (Emerald, 2013, co-edited with J. Wilson) and *Tourism Destination Evolution* (Routledge, 2016, co-edited with P. Brouder, A. Gill and D. Ioannides).
